- Women in construction

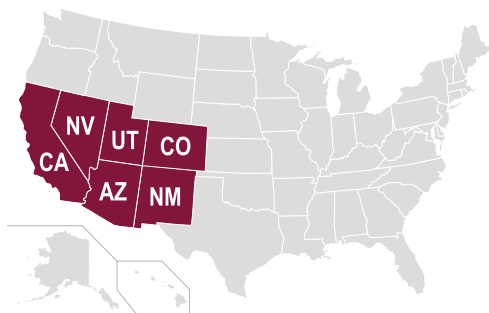
